



Articulation Agreement for students who have completed the A.A.S degree in Cybersecurity at SUNY Rockland to BS degree in Cybersecurity at Mercy College

Purpose

This document establishes an articulation between SUNY Rockland (RCC) and Mercy College. The purpose of this program is to facilitate educational and career mobility for students who earn an A.A.S degree in Cybersecurity at RCC and wish to continue on for a baccalaureate degree at Mercy College.

The program provides a seamless transition from the community college to the baccalaureate program ensuring students' awareness of all the necessary requirements for both degrees. In addition, students will be encouraged and assisted with guided long range planning from the moment they are accepted to the Community College program in conjunction with faculty advisors from both RCC and Mercy College.

Objectives of the agreement

1. To promote the transfer of qualified students in Associate's degree program at RCC into the Bachelor's degree program in Cybersecurity at Mercy College.
2. To provide admission information by way of fliers, catalogs, brochures, and seminars to RCC students who may wish to pursue their studies at Mercy College.
3. To attract students to RCC and Mercy College who are interested in taking advantage of the benefits of this articulation agreement between both institutions.
4. To provide a program of suggested courses that would ensure that students who meet the requirements of the A.A.S. degree in Cybersecurity at RCC could transfer to the Bachelor's degree program in Cybersecurity at Mercy College without a loss of credits.
5. To counsel and mentor RCC students interested in transferring to Mercy College to ensure that they have the proper prerequisites for the Bachelor's program.
6. To encourage academic coordination and other faculty/administrative interaction to facilitate the transfer process.
7. To periodically meet to evaluate the success of the articulation agreement and devise methods to continue to improve/strengthen it.

8. To increase the number of students from RCC who successfully complete both the Associate's and Bachelor's degree programs and who prepare to enter post-graduate programs in Cybersecurity.

Terms of the agreement

1. Each institution will designate a curriculum chair and a transfer student counselor to serve as a liaison between the colleges and to implement the logistics of this agreement.
2. Mercy College will accept in transfer up to 75 credits from RCC or any other two-year institution and an additional 15 credits from a four year institution or from CLEP exams.
3. The curriculum chairperson and transfer counselors at RCC will make available to students advisement sheets outlining specific course requirements and sequences necessary to meet both the graduation requirements for the Associate's degree program at RCC and the Bachelor's degree program in Cybersecurity at Mercy College. These sheets will be updated as necessary.
4. Only courses with a grade of "C" or above will be accepted for transfer credit for major level courses. Except where otherwise noted, students receiving a "D,C or C-" grade in any other course may transfer that course as long as it is part of the Associates degree program.
5. Mercy College will accept all RCC courses cooperatively agreed upon and designated in the schedules of courses (attached) as equivalent for transfer and satisfying the prerequisite requirements for admission into the respective programs at Mercy. The college coordinators agree to review and update this agreement and the recommended schedule of courses whenever substantial changes in the admission requirements, courses or programs of either institution occur.
6. This agreement will remain in effect until one or both of the parties indicate an interest in terminating it. The party wishing to terminate should give one year's notice.
7. This agreement will commence with the class entering in the Spring of 2011.

Articulation Procedures

Students planning to enter the BS program at Mercy College for the fall semester should file an application no later than April 1, and no later than November 1 for the spring semester. The application fee will be waived for students in the articulation program.

Changes in Degree Requirements

While it reserves the right to make changes in its curriculum and graduation requirements, Mercy College will honor the provisions of this agreement for students enrolled at Mercy through this articulation program who maintain continuous registration and do not miss three consecutive semesters.

Either party must give notice 6 months in advance before making any changes to this agreement.

The undersigned attest that they are duly authorized to enter into this agreement on behalf of Mercy College and Rockland Community College respectively.







Articulation Agreement for students who have completed the A.S. degree in Nursing at Rockland Community College and plan to complete the Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing at Mercy College

Purpose

This document establishes an articulation between the Nursing Departments of Rockland Community College (RCC) and Mercy College. The purpose of this program is to facilitate educational and career mobility for students who earn an A.S. degree in nursing at RCC and continue on for a baccalaureate degree in nursing at Mercy College.

The program provides a seamless transition from the community college to the baccalaureate program, ensuring students' awareness of all the necessary requirements for the bachelor's in nursing. In addition, students will be encouraged to do guided long range planning from the moment they are accepted to the community college program in conjunction with faculty advisors from both RCC and Mercy College.

Acceptance to Mercy College

Upon completion of a prescribed sequence of courses leading to the Associates in Science in Nursing at RCC (figure 1) and a satisfactory grade point average of 2.75 (C+) or above in both cumulative GPA and in the lower division nursing courses, RCC graduates will be accepted into the bachelor's program at Mercy College. Student also must have a current license (United States) as a registered nurse.

Students accepted into the Program will be assigned a Mercy College nursing faculty advisor. Mercy advising faculty will also offer pre-advising sessions each semester at RCC for students preparing to enter the program. The advisors will provide tracking sheets for the students to monitor their progress toward the degree.

Articulation Procedures

Students planning to enter the bachelor's. program at Mercy College for the Fall semester should file an application no later than April 1, and no later that November 1 for the spring semester. The application fee will be waived for students in the articulation program.

Changes in Degree Requirements

While it reserves the right to make changes in its curriculum and graduation requirements, Mercy College will honor the provisions of this agreement for students enrolled at Mercy through the Nursing articulation program who maintain continuous registration and do not miss three consecutive semesters.


Either party must give notice 6 months in advance before making any changes to this agreement.





Articulation Agreement for students who have completed the A.A. degree in Liberal Arts and Sciences/Humanities and Social Science/Elementary Education Pre K-6 at Rockland Community College and plan to complete the Five Year Bachelor of Science/Masters Degrees in Behavioral Science or Psychology with a Masters Degree in Childhood Education at Mercy College

Purpose

This document establishes an articulation between the Rockland Community College (RCC) and Mercy College. The purpose of this program is to facilitate educational and career mobility for students who earn an A.A degree in Liberal Arts and Sciences at RCC and wish to continue on for baccalaureate and masters degrees at Mercy College that will lead to initial certification as approved by the New York State Department of Education.

The program provides a seamless transition from the community college to the baccalaureate/masters programs ensuring students' awareness of all the necessary requirements for both degrees. In addition, students will be encouraged and assisted with guided long range planning from the moment they are accepted to the Community College program in conjunction with faculty advisors from both RCC and Mercy College.

Description of Program

The B.S./M.S. Dual Degree Program is an academic program that allows students interested in the teaching profession as a career choice to earn both a Bachelor's degree and a Master's degree in 5 years. Through this special program, qualified students who major in Psychology or Behavioral Science can receive teacher certification in Early Childhood or Childhood Education, and students who major in Biology, English, Mathematics, Social Studies or Spanish can receive teacher certification in Middle Childhood or Adolescence Education as well as Early Childhood or Childhood Education.

A key feature of this program allows students to take up to 15 graduate education credits during their upper junior and senior years, and these can be used toward satisfying their Bachelor's as well as their Master's degree requirements. Combining undergraduate and graduate degree programs streamlines our teacher preparation program and enables students to achieve teacher certification on an accelerated basis, reducing the time and cost needed to invest in a Master's degree. In addition, the multiple career options offer students the opportunity to acquire skills and credentials in several teaching specialization areas, thus increasing their employment potential in schools that need teachers to fill multiple and flexible roles.

Acceptance to Mercy College

Students must have an earned associate degree in the Liberal Arts with an overall GPA of 3.0. Students must maintain a GPA of 3.0 each semester at Mercy College to remain in the Five Year Program, and must adhere to the above requirements. An essay and an interview are admission criteria as well.

Students who do not meet the above admission criteria may apply to the dual program upon completion of the 60 credit General Education requirement and completion of at least 15 credits in their major field of study with an average of 3.0 or better. Thirty credits must be taken in residency at Mercy College.

Students accepted into the program will be assigned an advisor from the School of Social and Behavioral Sciences in conjunction with an advisor from the School of Education. Mercy advising faculty will also offer pre-advising sessions each semester at RCC for students preparing to enter the program. The advisors will provide tracking sheets for the students to monitor their progress toward the degree.

To remain in the Five Year Program, a student must:

- maintain a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 each semester at Mercy College
- register for an introductory 3-credit graduate education course in the upper junior year, or upon completion of 75 undergraduate credits with a B or better average
- register for 12 credits in graduate education courses in the senior year
- attempt the LAST in the fall semester of the junior year
- attempt the CST before the end of the senior year.
- attempt the ATS-W by the end of the senior year

Additionally, all matriculated Mercy College students are required to demonstrate an appropriate level of achievement in each of the eight (8) college competencies, to ascertain that they can communicate clearly and effectively both orally and in writing. They must also demonstrate their ability to use critical thinking and established methods of computation and contemporary technology. This early identification of potential areas of weakness enables students to monitor their progress in developing these skills. As part of this process, students have available to them the full resources of the College's academic support services, including the Centers for Independent Learning, Career Planning and Placement, and one-on-one tutorials with faculty.

Students who do not meet the requirements to remain in the dual degree program may complete the requirements for the BS degree in Behavioral Sciences or Psychology or any other liberal arts major for which they have the necessary requirements, and apply to the graduate program after they have received their bachelor's degree.

Articulation Procedures

Students planning to enter the BS/MS program at Mercy College for the Fall semester should file an application no later than April 1, and no later than November 1 for the spring semester. The application fee will be waived for students in the articulation program.

Changes in Degree Requirements

While it reserves the right to make changes in its curriculum and graduation requirements, Mercy College will honor the provisions of this agreement for students enrolled at Mercy through this articulation program who maintain continuous registration and do not miss three consecutive semesters.


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
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
