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## INTRODUCTION

*Congratulations on choosing Rockland Community College to begin your academic career.*

Transfer to a four-year institution is the goal of most RCC students. Students intending to transfer should meet with a faculty advisor early in their academic careers.

The College has established articulation agreements with a number of public and private four-year colleges. These agreements stipulate certain requirements students must meet while attending Rockland Community College in order to guarantee junior status in the major of their choice upon graduation and transfer. Visit the Student Development Center for the latest information.

Most students who wish to transfer are advised to pursue the Associate in Arts (AA) or Associate in Science (AS) degree. However, the Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degree, which is intended for students who are preparing for immediate entry into a technical field, may also be appropriate for students transferring to certain specialized baccalaureate programs. It is important to note that additional credit hours may be required of an AAS degree graduate who later decides to pursue a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree. For example, some transfer institutions require specific laboratory science and/or specific mathematics courses, therefore it is useful for students to consult the catalog and contact the admissions office of the four-year college to which they intend to transfer.

An opportunity to continue full-time study at a four-year SUNY college is guaranteed to all New York State residents who transfer directly from Rockland Community College with an AA or AS degree. Although this program assures admission to a four-year SUNY college, it does not assure admission to a specific campus or curriculum. In addition, students planning to transfer to a SUNY college should be aware of the SUNY General Education requirements. Students should seek advisement to plan their course of study during their first semester at RCC.

### **Transfer Scholarships**

The Rockland Community College Foundation partners with individuals and organizations to offer scholarships to our students who intend to transfer to institutions of higher learning. Students may apply for scholarships in early Spring.

## TRANSFER PLANNING: A 4-STEP PROCESS

### **Step 1: Know Yourself**

The first step in transferring is to know yourself and to identify the characteristics that are important to you in a four-year college.

**Consider:** your major, location of school, area of the country, distance from home, and the setting: urban, suburban, rural. **Costs:** tuition, room & board, books, availability of financial aid, scholarships, and travel. **Student body:** size, co-ed/single sex, and special population.

**Academic reputation. Social atmosphere:** sports, sororities & fraternities, clubs & organizations, and weekend activities. **Special needs:** disability services, multicultural student services, international student services, returning adult student services, religious affiliation, and child care.

### **Step 2: Research College**

To identify colleges that match your personal list of college characteristics, you'll need to do some research.

**Attend a Transfer Planning workshop.** Day and evening sessions are held in the Student Development Center, Technology Center, Suite 8220 throughout the academic year. To sign up, stop by the center or call 845-574-4307.

### **Use the reference materials in the Student Development**

**Center.** They include: Reference books, catalogs, transfer files, computers with internet access. Talk to the college representatives who visit RCC at the College Night Program held during the fall semester and at the Transfer College Fair program held during the spring semester. Talk to professors, parents and friends about their experiences regarding colleges. Visit college campuses and make an appointment to talk with admissions personnel, attend classes, and tour the campus.

### **Step 3: Apply to College**

**Contact colleges to request:** Application forms, financial aid forms, transfer guides, catalogs, information about housing, scholarship information SUNY/CUNY and some other college applications are available in the resource library of the Student Development Center. Read application materials carefully before completing them. Complete application forms and make a photocopy of each for your records. Mail completed application materials to the college or the processing center with the required application fee.

**Send official transcripts from:** high school (if required), Rockland Community College, all other colleges previously attended (Requests for RCC transcripts are turned in at the Bursars Office, Technology Center Lobby). Complete and process financial aid forms along with any requested supporting documentation. Send any additional application materials that colleges require: Letters of recommendation and Dean's forms/letters.

### **Step 4: Complete Transfer Process**

If you do not hear from a school to which you applied, call to inquire about the status of your application. Once you receive your acceptance letters: Make your decision regarding the school you wish to enroll at and send your final RCC transcript to that school. The school will then complete a final evaluation of transfer credits to be applied to your baccalaureate degree.

# BERKELEY COLLEGE

## *Business Administration*

### ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College graduates who have earned an AS or AAS degree in Business Administration, Accounting, or Marketing and have achieved a minimum of a 2.0 GPA may transfer to Berkeley College with no loss of credit. Berkeley College is on the “quarter hour system”, while Rockland Community College is on the “semester hour system.” One quarter hour of credit is earned for each 10-12 hours of scheduled class time at Berkeley. In essence, a 3-credit course completed at RCC will equate to a 4-credit course at Berkeley College. Students who receive an AA or AAS degree from RCC will be granted at least 60 semester (90 quarter) credits toward Berkeley’s BBA degree.

General Business is a broad-based program of study especially suited for those students who want the opportunity to broaden their education within the context of their career objectives. This flexible program encourages student to build concentrations in more than one specific area of study under the guidance of an academic advisor.

Requirements include the completion of at least 20 credits from one of the following degree programs: Management, Marketing, International Business, Accounting and Criminal Justice. In addition, business electives and free electives may be combined to complete more than one concentration.

Berkeley College offers protection from tuition increases to students who maintain continuous full-time enrollment. In addition, Berkeley College will offer five scholarships to RCC Associate degree graduates. Students with a GPA of 3.0 or higher entering Berkeley and enrolling into one of the Bachelor of Business Administration programs will be eligible for a scholarship of up to \$5,000 per academic year.

### ADVISEMENT

Students should seek advisement early in their academic career at Rockland Community College in order to ensure a smooth transition to a four-year institution.

### FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

Berkeley College offers a wide variety of financial assistance programs and financing options for students who need to supplement their own resources to meet college costs. Berkeley also offers protection from tuition increases to students who maintain continuous, full-time enrollment.

## BURLINGTON COLLEGE

### *Business Administration*

#### **ABOUT THE TRANSFER**

Rockland Community College graduates who complete an associate degree are eligible to pursue and earn a baccalaureate degree at Burlington College. Students who earn an associate's degree in Liberal Arts and Sciences (Humanities and Social Science), Fine Arts, and Photography and have earned a final grade point average of 3.0 or better are assured acceptance into Burlington College. In addition, students graduating with an associate degree in Hospitality, Graphic Design, and Computer Graphics who have earned a final grade point average of 3.0 or better are guaranteed acceptance as well. Students who have earned less than a 3.0 cumulative average may still apply to Burlington College, but without assured acceptance. Transfer students will be awarded up to a maximum of 60 credit hours earned at Rockland community College with a grade "C" or better.

Some students may require additional introductory level course work in addition to Junior/Senior course work to satisfy bachelor degree requirements. Transfer students will be subject to all general education and other requirements of Burlington College as set for in the Burlington College catalog.

#### **ADVISEMENT**

Students should seek advisement early in their academic career at RCC in order to ensure a smooth transition. Prospective students should complete the Application for Admission form on the website or contact the Office of Admissions. Official transcripts from each previously attended institution should be sent to Burlington College by using the Transcript Evaluation Request form located on the website.

#### **FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS**

Federal and State grants and low interest loans are available to students. Students wishing to file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine eligibility for Federal, State and Grants can visit [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) to file online. Eligible students may apply for the "Next Step" Transfer Student Scholarship that provides a 20% tuition discount award to students who have graduated with an associate's degree from an out-of-state community college, have a minimum GPA of 3.0, and enroll in a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Fine Arts degree program.

#### **ADMISSIONS**

Burlington College accepts applications on a rolling basis. Typically, an application and evaluation is completed in two weeks of receipt of the completed application information and receipt of official transcripts. Transfer applicants may be considered for the fall and spring semesters. There is no official deadline for submission of applications; however, scholarships, financial aid and course enrollment are limited. Students are encouraged to apply no later than May 1 for the fall semester and no later than December 15 for the spring semester.

# CHAMBERLAIN COLLEGE OF NURSING

## ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College graduates who earn an AS degree in Nursing are eligible to pursue a baccalaureate degree in nursing (BSN) at Chamberlain College. Chamberlain will award 80 semester transfer credits for approved nurses into its bachelor of science in nursing degree program for students with a minimum GPA of 2.0.\*\* Transfer students may need to take additional electives to meet the total degree requirement of 128 semester credits. Semesters are comprised of two eight-week sessions and all course credits are stated in terms of semester credit hours. There are three semesters each academic year.

Chamberlain requires a minimum of 32 hours of the required course credit hours in the baccalaureate curriculum be completed at Chamberlain in order to graduate.

\*\* Credit will not be awarded toward the Chamberlain BSN for courses that are not equivalent to requirements for the BSN degree at Chamberlain.

## ADVISEMENT

RCC nursing students are assigned a faculty advisor who will assist the student in developing an academic plan. Students interested in transferring to a four-year institution should seek advisement early in order to chart a comprehensive academic program.

## FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

Graduates who enroll in an attend the Chamberlain RN to BSN online nursing program will be charged tuition at 90% of the then-prevailing tuition rate applicable to the RN to BSN online program.

Federal and State grants and low interest loans are available to students. Students wishing to file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine eligibility for Federal, State and Grants can visit [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) to file online.

## ADMISSIONS

Students wishing to transfer to the Chamberlain BSN program will be considered for admission at Chamberlain when the following materials have been submitted: a completed application form; official college transcripts from all colleges and universities attended, including a transcript documenting an Associate of Science in Nursing degree; and a copy of the registered nurse license. Upon receipt and verification of these documents, the graduate shall be granted admission to the Chamberlain BSN program.

## COLLEGE OF MOUNT SAINT VINCENT

### ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College graduates who complete an associate degree are eligible to pursue and earn a baccalaureate degree at the College of Mount Saint Vincent. Students who earn an AA or AS degree with a minimum GPA of 2.0 are welcomed as applicants if all relevant and regular transfer admissions criteria are met. Students must earn a grade of "C" or better in an approved course in order to transfer it. All students transferring into the College with sixty or more transferable credits will be defined as juniors, will register at the same time as all other rising juniors, and will have all courses in the Core waived, except for the three (9 credits) junior and senior level Core enrichment courses. Courses of a purely technical nature, i.e., typing clinical nursing, will not be accepted in transfer.

### NURSING

Nursing major students require a 3.00 GPA. Students transferring to nursing must earn a 3.0 in the required science pre-requisite courses (Anatomy & Physiology I & II, General Chemistry I & II and Microbiology) within 5 years of beginning clinical courses if they wish to transfer these courses to the College.

### EDUCATION

Education major students require a 2.50 GPA. Students must have a 2.5 GPA by the end of the first semester of Teacher Education coursework taken at the College of Mount Saint Vincent. Certification to teach in New York State can be earned in the following areas: Birth-Grade 2, BA; Childhood, Grades 1-6, BA; Adolescence, Grades 7-12, BA in the following subject areas: Biology, Chemistry, English, French, Mathematics, Social Studies (History), and Spanish; Grades 7-12 and 5-6 in these same subject areas; Dual (Special Education and Grades 7-12), BA; Health Education, K-12, BS; and Physical Education, BS are four or five year program offerings. (This information may be changed at any time. Check with the New York State Education Department for current requirements.)

### ADVISEMENT

Counseling and advisement is provided by the College of Mount Saint Vincent for transfer students. Students are encouraged to do guided long-range planning from the moment they are accepted to Rockland in conjunction with faculty advisors from both Rockland and the College of Mount Saint Vincent.

### FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIP

Financial aid consists of funds from federal, state, university and private sources. Aid can come in the form of grants, scholarships, loans and part-time employment. Basic responsibility for financing higher education rests with students and their families; financial aid is offered to supplement the family's maximum financial effort.

The Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is used to determine eligibility for federal student and parent loans, institutional scholarships, Federal Perkins Loans, Federal Supplemental Educational Grants or Federal Work Study.

Applicants who have earned a cumulative grade point average of 3.2 or above will be considered for a Competitive Transfer Scholarship. The deadline for scholarship application is July 15 for fall entrants and December 15 for spring entrants. ## CORNELL UNIVERSITY

*College of Agriculture and Life Sciences*

### ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College students who graduate with an associate's degree in specified programs and with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher, will be granted full junior status at Cornell University, College of Agriculture and Life Sciences (CALS) and the opportunity to complete a Bachelor of Science degree with an additional 60 credits earned. Graduates will be considered competitive transfer applicants if their interests are appropriate and they meet GPA, course and profile requirements.

Applicants with less than the minimum cumulative average, course withdrawals, incompletes, part-time study or other factors will be considered individually.

Grades of "B" or better are transferable. CALS does not award credit for college courses taught in high school.

Prior to transfer, requirements are a minimum GPA of 3.0, satisfactory progress in the final semester prior to transfer, and full time status. In addition, the student must be in good disciplinary standing at Rockland Community College.

### ADVISEMENT

Transferring students will be assigned a program faculty advisor, who will assist the student in charting a comprehensive academic program. Students should seek advisement early in their academic career at Rockland Community College. To ensure that all transfer course requirements are fulfilled for the student's intended major, please visit [www.cals.cornell.edu/Transfer.cfm](http://www.cals.cornell.edu/Transfer.cfm).

### FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

For eligible students, Cornell tries to provide a predictable aid package throughout the years of college. Cornell awards financial aid on the basis of demonstrated financial need rather than on merit. There are no scholarships for merit, athletic or other talents. ### ADMISSIONS

# DOMINICAN COLLEGE

## ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College students who graduate with an AA, AS, or AAS degree in specified programs and with a cumulative GPA of 2.0, will be granted junior or upper-level status at Dominican College. Check the Dominican College catalog for higher GPA and further admissions standards for specific programs.

RCC graduates will be awarded up to a maximum of 70 credits earned at RCC as applicable to specified programs and/or institutional requirements. Courses for transfer must have been passed with a grade of "C-" or better. Courses transferred will receive full credit as awarded by RCC even if the equivalent Dominican course award is a different number of credits.

Students who have determined their major should consult the Dominican major sheets. Each major determines how many courses toward the major must be taken at Dominican and whether or not courses in which a grade below a C will apply to the major.

## ADVISEMENT

Transferring students will be assigned a program faculty advisor, who will assist the student in charting a comprehensive academic program.

## FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

Dominican College is strongly committed to enrolling qualified students, regardless of their financial means. Most students do seek and receive financial aid assistance in the form of scholarships, grants, loans or some combination thereof.

## ADMISSIONS

## EXCELSIOR COLLEGE

### ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College graduates are eligible to receive credit in parallel programs at Excelsior College. Students must hold a minimum GPA of 2.0 for admission to the program. Excelsior will accept up to 105 credits towards the bachelor degree. Courses for transfer must have been passed with a grade of "C" or better. No more than two credits of physical education activity coursework will be accepted toward an Excelsior degree.

### ADVISEMENT

Students should seek advisement early in their academic career at Rockland in order to ensure a smooth transition to Excelsior College.

### FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIP

Financial aid consists of funds from federal, state, university and private sources. Aid can come in the form of grants, scholarships, loans, and payment plans. Basic responsibility for financing higher education rests with students and their families; financial aid is offered to supplement the family's maximum financial effort.

The Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is used to determine eligibility for federal student and parent loans, institutional scholarships, Federal Perkins Loans, Federal Supplemental Educational Grants or Federal Work Study.

Enrolled and matriculated Excelsior students are eligible to apply for appropriate scholarships and payment plans.

# FAIRLEIGH DICKINSON UNIVERSITY

*Gildhart Haase School of Computer Sciences and Engineering*

## ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College graduates who complete an AS in engineering science are eligible to pursue and earn a baccalaureate degree in civil engineering technology, construction engineering technology, electrical engineering technology, mechanical engineering technology, electrical engineering, mathematics. Students must hold a minimum GPA of 2.5 for admission to the program.

Fairleigh Dickinson University will accept up to 63 credits towards each of the four bachelor of science degrees in engineering technology; 61 credits towards the bachelor of science in electrical engineering degree; and 67 credits towards the bachelor of science degree in mathematics.

## ADVISEMENT

Students should seek advisement early in their academic career at Rockland in order to ensure a smooth transition to Fairleigh Dickinson University's Gildhart Haase School of Computer Sciences and Engineering.

## FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIP

Financial aid consists of funds from federal, state, university and private sources. Aid can come in the form of grants, scholarships, and loans. Basic responsibility for financing higher education rests with students and their families; financial aid is offered to supplement the family's maximum financial effort.

The Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is used to determine eligibility for federal student and parent loans, institutional scholarships, Federal Perkins Loans, Federal Supplemental Educational Grants or Federal Work Study. Transfer scholarships are available from \$5,000 to \$10,000 to transfer students. Students who are members of the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society (PTK) are eligible for scholarships up to \$16,000 per year. Students must provide proof of PTK membership with the application.

## ADMISSIONS

Applications for admissions are processed on a rolling basis; therefore, students are encouraged to apply at the earliest opportunity to allow ample time to complete the application process. The application fee will be waived for students in the articulation program.

# FAIRLEIGH DICKINSON UNIVERSITY

## *Criminal Justice*

### **ABOUT THE TRANSFER**

Rockland Community College graduates who complete an AS in criminal justice are eligible to pursue and earn a baccalaureate degree in criminal justice. Students must hold a minimum GPA of 2.0 for admission to the program. Fairleigh Dickinson University (FDU) will accept up to 62 credits towards the bachelor degree and will accept the AS degree with specific courses as outlined in the agreement.

Rockland Community College students who complete the program recommended in the agreement will have met the General Education requirements at Fairleigh Dickinson University, with the exception of CORE 1006, CORE 2007, and CRIM 3304. The student will be required to complete these courses as part of the FDU degree.

### **ADVISEMENT**

Students should seek advisement early in their academic career at Rockland in order to ensure a smooth transition to Fairleigh Dickinson University's School of Criminal Justice and Legal Studies.

### **FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIP**

Financial aid consists of funds from federal, state, university and private sources. Aid can come in the form of grants, scholarships, and loans. Basic responsibility for financing higher education rests with students and their families; financial aid is offered to supplement the family's maximum financial effort.

The Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is used to determine eligibility for federal student and parent loans, institutional scholarships, Federal Perkins Loans, Federal Supplemental Educational Grants or Federal Work Study. Transfer scholarships are available from \$5,000 to \$10,000 to transfer students. Students who are members of the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society (PTK) are eligible for scholarships up to \$16,000 per year. Students must provide proof of PTK membership with the application.

### **ADMISSIONS**

Applications for admissions are processed on a rolling basis; therefore, students are encouraged to apply at the earliest opportunity to allow ample time to complete the application process. The application fee will be waived for students in the articulation program.

Since most scholarships are need-based, students must file the federal FAFSA to be considered. Franklin University awards a Phi Theta Kappa Transfer Scholarship, which is an honor society for students at two-year U.S. or international schools.

Rockland Community College graduates and employees may be eligible for a tuition discount.

### ADMISSIONS

Franklin University encourages students to complete their associate's degree at RCC before transfer. However, students have the opportunity to complete the first Franklin University course before completing their bridge courses at RCC. Students planning to complete their bachelor's degree at Franklin University may apply at any time during their enrollment at RCC.

# JOHN JAY COLLEGE (CUNY)

## *Criminal Justice*

### ABOUT THE TRANSFER

John Jay is the largest Criminal Justice college in the New York metropolitan area. In addition to a bachelor's degree, John Jay offers a master's and Ph.D. program in Criminal Justice. John Jay provides a unique schedule in selected classes, which are taught both day and evening by the same professor. Thus a student who works at night can attend the day class and vice versa. Saturday undergraduate classes are offered each semester.

RCC students who graduate with an AS in Criminal Justice/Police with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 may transfer to the Criminal Justice program with junior status. Students will be awarded up to a maximum of sixty-three (63) credits toward the fulfillment of a Bachelor's degree.

Students completing the AS degree program at RCC with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.5 are eligible to apply for admission to the BA/MA program in Criminal Justice. Under this program, students complete both a Bachelor's and Master's degree within 134 credits. Student in this program pay undergraduate tuition.

Courses are considered individually and only those courses where the student has earned a "C" or better are transferable. Students should seek advisement as early as possible in planning to transfer in order to select course equivalents according to the equivalency course guide. The Guide can be found in the RCC Student Development Center.

Students are eligible for internships at various city, state and federal agencies earn academic credit for their service and gain work experience and often make valuable contacts in the field.

### ADVISEMENT

Appropriate personnel will be available to advise intended direct transfer students, where available services will be discussed. The Office of Placement and Career Advisement helps students prepare for a career as well as for future studies in law school or graduate school.

### FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

The Laboratory Institute of Merchandising (LIM) will accept credits earned at Rockland Community College for admissions and degree requirements. RCC graduates with a GPA of 2.5 will be granted junior status in parallel programs and will be deemed to have satisfied the liberal arts core requirements. All courses taken and passed at RCC will be accepted for transfer.

LIM will accept up to 80 transfer credits earned at RCC. For all Bachelor's degrees, a minimum of 34 liberal arts credits are required.

RCC students who have successfully completed a course that LIM requires in the Upper Division will have those courses accepted in transfer and will be exempt from those courses. Students should consult with an LIM advisor about transferring RCC business elective requirements to LIM.

## ADVISEMENT

Transfer students registering for either the BBA degree (fashion merchandising or marketing) or the BBA degree (marketing) should seek advisement to ensure that Lower Division requirements are met prior to transferring to LIM.

## FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

LIM makes every attempt to assist students without the necessary financial resources achieve their educational goals. LIM offers a variety of scholarships, grants, loans and student employment opportunities, all of which are designed to support the entire educational career of the LIM student. Funds for federal and state grants and work-study programs are limited. Therefore, most students who are eligible for financial aid must also accept LIM's offer of recommended loans to meet their costs of attendance. Students are expected to meet part of their need through earnings from summer or school-year employment. Parents, when applicable, are also expected to contribute in proportion to their financial ability as determined by federal methodology.

## ADMISSIONS

Transfer students are required to go through the regular Upper Division application process. LIM will review and make decisions on individual applications. The application process includes a personal interview.

All students transferring to CUNY are subject to University testing requirements.

Transferring students will receive up to a maximum of 60 credits taken at RCC toward the Speech-Language Pathology BA Program. Courses for transfer must have been passed with a grade of "C-" or better.

#### ADVISEMENT

# LINCOLN UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA

## ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College students who graduate with an AA or AS degree are eligible to transfer into baccalaureate programs at Lincoln University in the School of Social Sciences and Behavioral Studies, School of Natural Sciences and Mathematics, and the School of Humanities. Graduates must hold a minimum GPA of 2.0 for admission into the program and will be granted "junior" standing. Courses for transfer must have been passed with a grade of "C" or better. Graduates will have satisfied all lower division Lincoln University core curricular requirements. Any exceptions to the core requirements will be satisfied by the student in the first year at Lincoln University.

## FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIP

Financial aid consists of funds from federal, state, university and private sources. Aid can come in the form of grants, scholarships, and loans. Basic responsibility for financing higher education rests with students and their families; financial aid is offered to supplement the family's maximum financial effort.

The Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is used to determine eligibility for federal student and parent loans, institutional scholarships, Federal Perkins Loans, Federal Supplemental Educational Grants or Federal Work Study. There are two scholarships available to community college graduates. The first is a non-renewable \$5,000 scholarship for graduates who hold an AA degree and have obtained a 3.50 GPA. The second is a \$3,500 non-renewable scholarship for students who graduate with an AA degree and have obtained a 3.25 GPA.

## ADMISSIONS

The student must complete the Intent to Transfer form and submit it to the Office of Admissions at the beginning of the last semester at Rockland Community College. The Lincoln University application for admission must be submitted with all required documentation by April 15 for fall term admission and December 15 for spring term admission. The admission application fee will be waived for students who submit the Intent to Transfer form. The Intent to Transfer form does not obligate the student to accept admission to Lincoln University; however, the student must notify University Admissions if he/she wishes to terminate participation in this agreement.

Students are required to submit documentation required for admission, including official transcripts, two letters of recommendation, a personal statement, and other documents or health records as required.

Rockland Community College students who graduate with an AA, AS, or AAS degree in specified programs and a cumulative GPA of 2.5, will be able to transfer with junior class standing (minimum of 58 credits, the minimum requirements for financial aid as a junior).

RCC graduates will be awarded credit for courses earned at RCC as applicable to specified programs and/or institutional requirements. Courses for transfer must have been passed with a grade of "C-" or better, with the exception of ENG 101 and 102, both of which must be completed with a minimum grade of C. Courses transferred will receive full credit as awarded by RCC even if the equivalent Manhattanville course award is a different number of credits. Courses that are intended to satisfy major or minor requirements at Manhattanville fall under the jurisdiction of the respective department and as such, must satisfy its minimum grade requirements. No more than one half of the major or one half of the minor may be satisfied with transfer credits.

Students who have determined their major, should consult the Manhattanville major sheets. Each major determines how many courses toward the major must be taken at Manhattanville College and whether or not courses in which a grade below a C will apply to the major. Rockland Community College students who graduate with an Associate's degree and a GPA of 2.0 (Teacher Certification Candidates must possess a 3.0 for admission to teacher education programs) will be accepted with junior status, unless otherwise noted. Teacher Certification Candidates and Biology/Sports Medicine students may need to complete an additional semester. Prior credits from another college, other than RCC, will be evaluated on an individual basis.

All courses accepted as free electives carry graduation credit at the lower level unless otherwise noted.

Students must complete a minimum of 45 credits at MCLA and a minimum of 39 credits of upper level coursework. Transferring students must achieve an overall GPA of 2.0, excluding transfer coursework from RCC.

## ADVISEMENT

Students should seek advisement early in their academic career at RCC in order to ensure a smooth transition to a four-year institution.

## FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

The Office of Financial Aid administers federal and state financial aid programs. Over 80% of Massachusetts College matriculated undergraduate students receive some form of financial aid, which is awarded on the basis of need. Most financial aid packages consist of a combination of grants, loan and part-time employment. Student aid funds come primarily from state and federal programs such as Pell Grants, Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant, MASS Grant, the College Work-Study Program, Perkins Loan and Stafford Student Loans. For students who do not have their needs met or do not qualify for financial aid, there are a number of alternative loan and payment plans available.

## ADMISSIONS

The Admissions Office operates on a rolling admission cycle and advises transfer students to apply early. Fall admission acceptance commence in early January whereas acceptances for mid-year (spring term) begin in November.

## MERCY COLLEGE

### Teacher Education

#### ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College graduates who earn an AA degree in Liberal Arts and Sciences are eligible to continue on for a baccalaureate and masters degrees at Mercy College that will lead to initial certification as approved by the New York State Department of Education.

A key feature of this program allows student to take up to 15 graduate education credits during their upper junior and senior years, and these can be used toward satisfying their bachelor's as well as their master's degree requirements.

The BS/MS Dual Degree Program is an academic program that allows students interested in the teaching profession as a career choice to earn both a Bachelor's degree and a Master's degree in 5 years. Through this special program, qualified students who major in Psychology or Behavioral Science can receive teacher certification in Early Childhood or Childhood Education, and students who major in Biology, English, Mathematics, Social Studies or Spanish can receive teacher certification in Middle Childhood or Adolescence Education as well as Early Childhood or Childhood Education. Multiple career options offer students the opportunity to acquire skills and credentials in several teaching specialization areas.

Students must have an earned associate degree in the Liberal Arts with an overall GPA of 3.0. Students must maintain a GPA of 3.0 each semester to remain in the five-year program. Students who do not meet the above admission criteria may apply to the Dual Program upon completion of the 60 credit General Education requirement and completion of at least 15 credits in their major field of study with an average of 3.0 or better. Thirty credits must be taken at Mercy College.

Students who do not meet the requirements to remain in the dual degree program may complete the requirements for the BS degree in Behavioral Sciences or Psychology or any other liberal arts major for which they have the necessary requirements, and apply to the graduate program after they have received their bachelor's degree.

#### ADVISEMENT

Students are encouraged to do guided long-range planning from the moment they are accepted at RCC in conjunction with faculty advisors from both RCC and Mercy College. Students accepted into the program will be assigned an advisor from the School of Social and Behavioral Sciences in conjunction with an advisor from the School of Education. Mercy advising faculty will also offer pre-advising sessions each semester at RCC for students preparing to enter the program.

#### FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

## MOUNT SAINT MARY COLLEGE

### ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College graduates transferring to Mount Saint Mary College with an Associate of Arts (AA) degree or an Associate of Science (AS) degree in a major taught at the college are awarded full junior status and 60 transfer credits. The Mount will accept grades of C or better. A grade of "D" is acceptable only as the first part of sequential subjects in which a grade of "C" or better is achieved in the second part, i.e. BIO1130: "D"; BIO1140: "C".

Graduates with an AAS in Accounting, Business Administration, Communication, Media Arts, and Computer Information Systems will also be accepted with full "junior" status and 60 transfer credits.

"D" grades may be used to bring the transfer credits to the guaranteed level of 60 credits. Credits equivalent to RCC's requirements for the AA or AS degree (to a maximum of 66 credits) will be accepted only for grades of "C" or better. "D" grades are not accepted for any part of the maximum award.

Transfer credit for service learning, independent study and special topics courses is determined by the Division Chairperson in each content area. A minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 for the four years of study, two years at RCC and two years at the Mount, is required to earn a bachelors degree. Refer to other GPA requirements for specific degrees on the website.

### ADULT ACCELERATED PROGRAM

The adult accelerated degree program is dedicated to assist adult students reach their academic and professional goals. The program offers seven accelerated bachelor degree programs that are delivered in six or eight week evening/weekend and hybrid (blended online) sessions. Current programs include: Accounting, Business Management and Administration, History, Human Services, Interdisciplinary BA in Childhood Education, Nursing and Psychology. A discounted tuition rate is available to students 24 years of age and older.

### ADVISEMENT

### FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

Students can visit [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) to file online, as it allows for quicker processing by using The Mount's school code, 002778.

\*Award amount varies according to residency status and level of financial need.

MSMC offers a full tuition scholarship to an eligible RCC graduate with a 3.5 GPA or above. Refer to the RCC Scholarship Booklet for further information.

- Requirements for the selected major concentration

Students, who are not accepted to their initial program or major of choice, may be accepted to a different program or major for which their coursework qualifies.

# SUNY ALBANY

## ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Under the joint admissions program, students may be admitted to Rockland Community College and the University at Albany as freshmen, with conditional acceptance to the University at Albany with junior status after completion of one of the Programs of Study. Candidates selected for the joint admissions program will receive a letter of acknowledgement from the Admissions Office at the University at Albany during the first semester of study at RCC. Following completion of the two-year program at RCC, in which minimum academic achievement levels must be attained, students will automatically move to the Albany campus to complete the final two years and the bachelor's degree.

While enrolled at RCC and completing the requirements for an associate's degree, students are considered by the University at Albany as part of its academic community. Besides setting up a systematic method of communication with each student throughout this two-year period, students will be encouraged to attend appropriate functions at the University at Albany.

Qualified applicants who wish to transfer to the University at Albany who are not following a Program of Study outlined in the "Transfer Degrees" section will also be considered for admission. However, you will need to plan your associate degree program carefully in order to ensure maximum transferability of credit.

Rockland Community College graduates will be awarded up to a maximum of 64 credits earned at RCC as applicable to specified programs and/or institutional requirements. Courses for transfer must have been passed with a grade of "C-" or better.

It is the responsibility of the student to carefully read all the information about your choice of major. Should you have questions regarding transferring to the University at Albany, please consult with the RCC Student Development Center.

## ADVISEMENT

Several programs at the University at Albany have very specific requirements for admission to the major (Accounting, Business Administration, Criminal Justice, Psychology, Rhetoric and Communication and Social Welfare). The admission requirements have important implications for the course which should be taken at RCC.

## FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

The University at Albany administers all general federal and state student assistance programs as well as aid from the University. Eligible applicants will be considered for grants, student loans, and/or student employment.

## ADMISSIONS

A sizable number of undergraduates transfer into the University at Albany from other colleges and universities each year. In addition to submitting a Basic Application, Part I and a supplemental application, Part II, transfer applicants must submit official transcripts of all work taken at any college or university, whether or not they expect to receive transfer credit.

## ABOUT THE TRANSFER

### **Traditional Nursing Transfer Program**

Rockland Community College graduates transferring to Binghamton University, Decker School of Nursing with an Associate of Arts (AA) degree or an Associate of Science (AS) degree with a cumulative and pre-requisite grade point average of at least 3.0 in courses toward their degree will enter as matriculated students in the Decker School of Nursing Traditional Transfer Program. All transfer admissions criteria must be met. Upon approval of 57 or more total transfer credits, students will be granted "junior" status.

Students are encouraged to complete all the General Education (GenEd) requirements and Nursing pre-requisite courses at Rockland Community College as part of the AA/AS degree. These courses are required to be completed prior to beginning the upper division nursing course sequence that begins only in the fall semester. To receive a baccalaureate degree, students must complete 52 credits of required nursing courses at Binghamton and any remaining pre-requisite, GenEd or elective courses as needed to achieve 128 credits.

### **RN Transfer Program**

Rockland Community College graduates transferring to Binghamton University, Decker School of Nursing with an Associate of Science (AS) degree and are or will be licensed as a Registered Nurse (RN) prior to the second semester at Binghamton in the RN Transfer Program or prior to enrollment at Binghamton in the Accelerated RN Transfer Program will enter as matriculated students. All transfer admissions criteria must be met. Upon approval of 57 or more total transfer credits, students will be granted "junior" status.

RN graduates with an AS in Nursing from RCC will be awarded credit for all applicable GenEd and pre-requisite courses toward the 128 credits required for the BS in Nursing. These credits will include nursing courses with 20 of those nursing credits applied toward the required

upper division nursing courses and all other nursing credits applied to elective courses according to Decker School requirements. To complete the BS degree, a minimum of 32 credits of required nursing courses must be completed at Binghamton, any GenEd and/or nursing pre-requisite requirements for the Decker School not previously completed and elective credits as needed to total 128 credits.

## ADVISEMENT

Each transferring student will be assigned a program advisor who will assist the student in charting a comprehensive academic plan.

## FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

Binghamton's Decker School of Nursing offers various types of financial support to graduate nursing students. Assistantships, traineeship/fellowships, loans/work study and other assistantships are available.

All students should file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible to determine eligibility for Federal, State and grants. Students can visit [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) to file online.

## ADMISSIONS

A completed application must be received by February 15 for fall admission and November 15 for spring admission.

# SUNY BINGHAMTON UNIVERSITY

*School of Management*

## ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College graduates who complete an associate degree are eligible to pursue and earn a baccalaureate degree in the School of Management. Students who earn an AA or AS degree with a GPA of at least 3.5 and grade "C" or better are welcomed as applicants if all relevant and regular transfer admissions criteria are met. Upon successful transfer into Binghamton University, RCC graduates will be granted "junior" status upon acceptance of 57 or more total transferred credits. Courses transferred will receive full credit as awarded by RCC.

Microeconomics and macroeconomics and calculus or statistics are strongly considered in the admission review, since all 4 courses are pre-requisites for upper level management coursework. To receive a BS from the School of Management, students must complete the University General Education (GenEd) and School of Management requirements including specific requirements applicable to their degree program and concentration. Binghamton accepts all GenEd credits already awarded at RCC. It is recommended that in anticipation of transfer, students complete the 2 course composition and writing requirement and as many of the General Education requirements as possible. The last 30 credits must be completed at Binghamton University prior to graduation, as well as a minimum of one-half of the management and accounting courses required for the baccalaureate degree.

The foreign language requirement for all transfers is one college course at any level. Waivers are possible if your native language is not English or if complete sufficient high school language study.

## ADVISEMENT

Every residential community at Binghamton University includes transfer-student mentors who are familiar with the unique needs of transfer students and are dedicated to assisting every step of the way. Off-campus students are offered mentors, too.

## FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

Financial aid consists of funds from federal, state, university and private sources. Aid can come in the form of grants, scholarships, loans and part-time employment. Basic responsibility for financing higher education rests with students and their families; financial aid is offered to supplement the family's maximum financial effort.

The Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is used to determine eligibility for federal student and parent loans, institutional scholarships, Federal Perkins Loans, Federal Supplemental Educational Grants or Federal Work Study.

University scholarships are awarded based on both academic merit and financial need. Since most Binghamton University scholarships are need-based, students must file the federal FAFSA to be considered.

Various federal and New York State grants are available to students. They include the Academic Competitiveness Grant, National SMART Grant, Pell Grants, Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant (SEOG), TEACH Grant, Aid for Part-Time Study (APTS), and Tuition Assistance Program (TAP).

Students have a number of loan options, which may be offered to you as part of your financial aid package. They include federal direct loans, federal parent loans, Perkins loans, nursing loans, Director Graduate PLUS loan, and alternative loans.

Binghamton University awards several scholarships each fall semester to members of Phi Theta Kappa which is an honor society for students at two-year U.S. or international schools. Selection is competitive, and to be considered, an application is required by March 15.

A completed application must be received by February 15 for fall admission and by November 1 for spring admission.

## ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College graduates who complete an associate degree are eligible to pursue and earn a baccalaureate degree in electrical, mechanical, industrial and systems, and computer engineering in the Watson School of Engineering and Applied Science. Graduates who have earned an associate degree with at least a 3.0 GPA will be accepted as matriculated students in the Watson School, provided that all engineering transfer admission criteria are met, including pre-requisite courses outlined in the transfer brochure. Students are held to the degree requirements as stated in the University Bulletin for their academic year of matriculation.

Credits awarded through programs including Advance Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB) and College Level Examination Program (CLEP) will also be considered for transfer based upon official proof of minimum required scores.

## ADVISEMENT

Students should seek advisement early in their academic career at Rockland in order to ensure a smooth transition to the Thomas J. Watson School degree program. Further information about transfer course equivalencies that should be taken within the first two years of study at RCC to fulfill SUNY GenEd and/or Watson School requirements is located in the Student Development Center.

## FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIP

## SUNY BROCKPORT

### *Physical Education Teacher Education (PETE)*

#### **ABOUT THE TRANSFER**

Rockland Community College graduates who complete an associate degree are eligible to pursue and earn a baccalaureate degree as a Physical Education Teacher Education major. Students holding an approved associate degree may transfer up to 64 credits. Such students will automatically be granted at least 60 credits and “junior status”. Some students may need more than 60 additional credits to complete the baccalaureate degree requirements depending on previous courses and the courses selected at SUNY Brockport. All students must complete the SUNY GenEd requirements. It is recommended that students complete as many GenEd courses as possible while attending Rockland Community College.

Prior to enrolling in PEP 441 Introduction to Teaching Physical Education, students must have a 2.5 Brockport grade point average for at least 12 credits of work of which no more than 25 percent of the credits are in “activity” classes.

#### **ADVISEMENT**

Students should seek advisement early in their academic career at RCC in order to ensure a smooth transition to a four-year institution.

#### **FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS**

Scholarships and awards vary in monetary value. Some are renewable for up to four years and some require additional information, such as an essay, a portfolio, college transcript, or letters or recommendation; or, the scholarship may be limited to students who plan to major in specific fields of study. Entering transfer students with a GPA of 3.25 or higher will be considered for entering student scholarships and awards. Refer to the SUNY Brockport website for further information.

# SUNY COBLESKILL AT ROCKLAND COMMUNITY COLLEGE

## *Business Administration*

### **ABOUT THE TRANSFER**

Rockland Community College graduates are eligible to pursue and earn a baccalaureate degree in business administration degree programs offered by SUNY Cobleskill. Rockland graduates shall be entitled to participate in the Seamless Partnership Program. During their 3rd and 4th years, students will satisfy their lower level coursework by taking classes offered by RCC at its campus and must also take certain upper level courses offered by SUNY Cobleskill. Cobleskill courses may be taken at the RCC campus – either in person, by video link or other means of distance education with SUNY Cobleskill, or on the SUNY Cobleskill campus. Students must complete 45 credits with SUNY Cobleskill.

Courses with grades of C or better will be accepted for transfer credit. Courses with grade of “C- or D+” may be accepted for elective credit only. A minimum GPA of 2.25 is required. Students who do not meet the requirements of the agreement will be considered for admission on an individual basis.

### **ADVISEMENT**

Students should seek advisement early in their academic career at Rockland in order to ensure a smooth transition to SUNY Cobleskill. Students should meet with the community college coordinator for the SUNY Cobleskill program. Course enrollment will occur at the respective campuses.

Books and supplies will be available to students at SUNY Cobleskill and the RCC Book Store.

### **FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIP**

Financial aid consists of funds from federal, state, university and private sources. Aid can come in the form of grants, scholarships, and loans. Basic responsibility for financing higher education rests with students and their families; financial aid is offered to supplement the family’s maximum financial effort.

The Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is used to determine eligibility for federal student and parent loans, institutional scholarships, Federal Perkins Loans, Federal Supplemental Educational Grants or Federal Work Study.

For the purposes of including state aid to the institution, during their 3rd and 4th years, the students will be considered SUNY Cobleskill students. SUNY Cobleskill will monitor student eligibility and disbursement of financial aid to students.

### **ADMISSIONS**

Transfer students must complete and file the SUNY Admissions application indicating transfer to SUNY Cobleskill prior to November 1 for spring semester entry, and prior to April 15 for fall semester entry. SUNY Cobleskill will make final admission decisions.

Students enrolled in SUNY Cobleskill’s programs shall pay tuition and applicable fees for programs directly to SUNY Cobleskill in accordance with the published rate schedule of SUNY Cobleskill. Matters of registration/enrollment, transfer credit from other institutions, student conduct code affirmation, financial aid, and billing and collections shall be addressed by the appropriate SUNY Cobleskill office.

SUNY Cobleskill students, who are New York State residents and who take RCC courses, will complete a county certificate of residency annually, which will be submitted to RCC at the time of registration.

# SUNY COLLEGE OF ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE AND FORESTRY

## ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College graduates transferring to the SUNY College of Environmental Science and Forestry (SUNY ESF) who meet all guidelines are awarded full junior status. SUNY ESF will accept grades of C or better. Admission to the bachelor degree program at the Syracuse campus of SUNY ESF will be guaranteed in all programs of study for RCC students who have achieved a 2.5 cumulative grade point average or higher. Additionally, students are expected to be prepared for pre-calculus level mathematics or higher for admission purposes.

## ADVISEMENT

Transfer students should seek advisement from a SUNY ESF Admissions Counselor.

## FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

Federal and State grants and low interest loans are available to students. Students wishing to file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine eligibility for Federal, State and Grants can visit [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) to file online.

## SCHOLARSHIP GENERAL GUIDELINES

Merit scholarships at ESF are awarded in recognition of outstanding academic and extracurricular achievements, regardless of financial need. Some students who are awarded merit scholarships choose not to apply for need-based financial aid or do not qualify for that type of aid. Other students receive merit scholarships as part of a financial aid award. Admission application files are reviewed by the Undergraduate Admission Office to determine each student's eligibility for ESF merit scholarships. ESF offers merit-based scholarship programs. Information can be found on the Financial Aid website at [www.esf.edu/financialaid](http://www.esf.edu/financialaid).

## TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS

Many transfer students qualify for Phi Theta Kappa Scholarships at ESF. These are valued at \$1,500 per year and may be combined with other aid. Transfer applicants who have earned a college grade point average of 3.4 or higher will be considered for ESF Presidential Scholarships of up to \$3,000 per year for New York State residents or up to \$6,000 per year for out-of-state residents.

## Legacy Scholarships

ESF awards scholarships to incoming freshman and transfer students who are the children or grandchildren of ESF alumni. Eligible students receive scholarships worth \$250 per semester for up to ten semesters of full-time undergraduate study. Scholarships are renewed each semester for students who maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher. Financial need is not required for scholarship selection, but an applicant's academic record and extracurricular activities will be taken into consideration.

## Paper Science and Engineering Scholarships

Scholarships from the Syracuse Pulp and Paper Foundation, Inc. are awarded to undergraduate students majoring in paper science or paper engineering who are United States citizens or permanent residents. Awards for transfer students are based on GPA. Awards are renewed each semester subject to scholarship committee approval.

## ADMISSIONS

Students must complete the application for admission by the recommended filing deadline for the semester they intend to enroll. Applications completed after the recommended deadline will be considered on a space available basis. Students who are not able to complete all pre-requisites prior to their desired semester of enrollment or have less than a 2.5 cumulative grade point average, may still be considered for admission to ESF. Students should forward official high school transcripts, and college(s) transcripts if applicable, along with a completed application and fee.

### ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College students who complete an Associate of Science Degree in Physical Education Studies with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 will be admitted with junior status. Students must complete a minimum of seven of the 10 General Education Requirements.

Rockland Community College graduates will be awarded up to a maximum of 64 credits. Half of the credits in the major(s) and concentration and a minimum of 45 hours of course work must be completed in residency at Cortland. The transfer student must complete at least four semesters of course work at SUNY Cortland. Additional time may be needed depending on the concentration and/or dual major and foreign language requirements.

Students who transfer to SUNY Cortland benefit from a waiver of the Cortland General Education Requirements (not SUNY General Education requirements). Students are eligible to participate in internships and study abroad programs.

### ADVISEMENT

Students should seek advisement early in their academic career at RCC in order to ensure a smooth transition to a four-year institution.

### FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

Students who have completed an Associate of Science degree in Physical Education will be granted junior status for financial aid purposes. Students are also eligible for transfer scholarships.

### ADMISSIONS

Transfer students should submit official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended; an undergraduate application ([www.cortland.edu/admissions/apply.html](http://www.cortland.edu/admissions/apply.html)); and the supplemental application ([www.cortland.edu/admissions/supplemental/index.html](http://www.cortland.edu/admissions/supplemental/index.html)). Student with prior military service must also provide a copy of their discharge papers (DD214). ## SUNY OSWEGO

### ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College students who graduate with an AA, AS, or AAS degree in specified programs will be accepted as juniors. Students must also meet the General Education requirements. Waivers may be granted upon the completion of an associate's degree, foreign language is met through high school records indicating language through Regents 4, foreign language is met for students if they are native speakers of a non-English language and have significant experience in the culture associated with that language, or can document an equivalent amount of education in another language.

Rockland Community College graduates will be awarded up to a maximum of 62-67 credit hours, which will be applied towards the SUNY Oswego bachelor's degree. A maximum combined total of 48 credit hours in any one discipline can be applied to the Bachelor of Arts degree requirement.

It should be noted that students must complete:

- one-half of the major coursework at SUNY Oswego
- A minimum of 30 credit hours at SUNY Oswego
- A minimum of 42 credit hours of coursework at the 300- or 400-level
- A minimum of 60 credit hours at a four-year institution

All students transferring from RCC will need to complete the local requirements not covered by articulation, which include:

- Human Diversity (which may be taken on or off campus)
- Tolerance & Intolerance in the U.S.\*
- Intellectual Issues (which may not be taken off campus)

\*To determine if a class at RCC will meet the Human Diversity:

Tolerance & Intolerance in the U.S. requirements, please contact the SUNY Oswego Transfer Coordinator.

### ADVISEMENT

Transferring students will be assigned a program faculty advisor, who will assist the student in charting a comprehensive academic program.

### ADMISSIONS

Students must submit an official transcript from Rockland Community College and any other colleges or universities previously attended.

## SUNY STONY BROOK UNIVERSITY

### ABOUT THE TRANSFER

RCC students who graduate with an AA or AS degree with a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 may select from one of the majors in the College of Arts and Sciences. RCC graduates who have completed an AS in Business or an AS in Liberal Arts and Science with the cumulative GPA of 3.1 will be guaranteed admission to SUNY Stony Brook's Business Management major. This major also requires the completion of a minor for graduation from SUNY Stony Brook.

Completion of degree requirements can usually be made within four semesters depending on coursework completed at RCC and the major chosen at SUNY Stony Brook. Students should plan on completing relevant entry skills at Rockland and general education requirements and the lower division courses required by their major department. Students must follow all transfer credit policies and earn a C or better for all major courses to transfer. SUNY Stony Brook accepts transfer credits only, not course grades.

### ADVISEMENT

The Undergraduate Transfer Office provides academic advice to prospective and enrolled transfer students. ## THE COLLEGE OF NEW ROCHELLE

Rockland Community College graduates with an AA, AS, or AAS in the specified programs with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 transferring to The College of New Rochelle who meet all guidelines are granted full "junior status". Qualified Rockland graduates will be awarded up to a maximum of 75 credits earned at RCC as applicable to specified programs and/or institutional requirements at The College of New Rochelle.

RCC graduates who hold either an AA or AS degree will be deemed to have fulfilled all General Education Requirements. RCC graduates who hold an AAS degree will be deemed to have fulfilled all General Education requirements provided they have completed at least one credit-bearing mathematics course with a grade of "C-" or better and ENG 102 with a grade of "C" or better. Courses will receive full credit even if the equivalent College of New Rochelle course award is a different number of credits.

### ADVISEMENT

Each transferring student will be assigned a program faculty advisor, who will assist the student in charting a comprehensive academic plan allowing for graduation in the shortest time possible, usually two years of full-time study or its part-time equivalent.

### FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

Federal and State grants and low interest loans are available to students. Students wishing to file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine eligibility for Federal, State and Grants can visit [www.fafsa.edu.gov](http://www.fafsa.edu.gov) to file online.

Each transferring student with a RCC GPA of 2.5 or higher will be eligible for a merit scholarship.

### ADMISSIONS

Students are expected to adhere to general academic policies and procedures required for admission to The College of New Rochelle, and to fulfill any particular requirements (regarding GPA, prerequisites, clinical experience, etc.) that may be in place for certain academic programs at the College.

Students should forward official high school transcripts, and college(s) transcripts if applicable, along with a completed application and fee.

## ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College graduates with an AA in Fire Science Technology or AAS in Fire Protection Technology transferring to the University of New Haven (UNH), Henry C. Lee College of Criminal Justice and Forensic Sciences, BS in Fire Science Administration degree will be awarded up to a maximum of 60 credits earned at RCC as applicable to specified programs and/or institutional requirements at the University of New Haven.

Graduates who earn a "C" or better will qualify for the awarding of transfer credit by UNH, consistent with its prevailing policy on transfer credit. RCC courses not explicitly articulated in this agreement may qualify for transfer credit at UNH, provided the student has earned a "C" or better in the course the course has an appropriate UNH correlate and satisfies a degree requirement.

## ADVISEMENT

Students should seek advisement early on at RCC to be prepared for transfer upon completion of their degree.

## FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

### *Transfer Presidential Scholarship (\$9,000 - \$15,000)*

The Transfer Presidential Scholarship is intended for students who are transferring from another college or university and have completed 12 credit hours at their transferring institution and have a minimum GPA of 3.0. The scholarship awards vary depending on the student's GPA. The Transfer Presidential Scholarship is renewable each year provided you remain a full-time undergraduate student while maintaining satisfactory progress towards a bachelor's degree and a "B" (3.0) cumulative grade point average.

### *Phi Theta Kappa Scholarships (\$2,000)*

A student who has been inducted into the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society may be considered for an additional \$2,000 scholarship. This award is in addition to being considered for the Transfer Presidential Scholarship.

The PTK Scholarship is renewable each year provided you remain a full-time undergraduate student while maintaining satisfactory progress towards a bachelor's degree and a "B" (3.0) cumulative grade point average.

Students should contact a Transfer Admissions Counselor to discuss their goals and the admissions process for transfer students.

### ABOUT THE TRANSFER

Rockland Community College graduates with an AA, AS, or AAS in the specified programs may transfer to the University of Maryland University College (UMUC) who meet all guidelines and have a minimum GPA of 2.0. Qualified Rockland graduates will be awarded up to a maximum of 70 credits with a 2.0 or better earned at RCC as applicable to specified programs and/or institutional requirements at UMUC. RCC and UMUC allow simultaneous admission. UMUC shall accept transfer credits up to a maximum of 70 credits if: the grade earned in the course in question is at least a "C"; the student does not take the equivalent course at UMUC; and the course is not being awarded UMUC credits directly.

### ADVISEMENT

Students should seek advisement early in their academic career at RCC in order to ensure a smooth transition to a four-year institution.
