## AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN ROCKLAND COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK AT STONY BROOK

The purpose of this agreement is to establish a cooperative endeavor to encourage and facilitate the transfer of Rockland Community College students, hereinafter referred to as Rockland, to the State University of New York at Stony Brook, hereinafter referred to as SBU. This agreement is made and entered into in May 2009.

Rockland students who have completed an Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degree at Rockland in one of the programs listed in Appendix A with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 may select from one of our many majors offered in the College of Arts and Sciences at SBU listed in Appendix B.

Rockland students who have completed an Associate in Science degree in Business or an Associate in Science degree in Liberal Arts and Science with a cumulative grade point average of 3.1 will be guaranteed admission to Stony Brook's Business Management major. This major also requires the completion of a minor for graduation from Stony Brook.

Completion of degree requirements within four semesters is possible depending on coursework completed at Rockland and the major chosen at Stony Brook. A course articulation guide is attached to this agreement to help facilitate a seamless transfer. However, students are not guaranteed to complete their baccalaureate degree at Stony Brook in four additional semesters (or the equivalent for part-time students) in the programs listed in Appendix B. Students should plan on completing relevant entry skills at Rockland and general education requirements and the lower division courses required by their major department as outlined in the Stony Brook Undergraduate Bulletin. Students should also choose a parallel major to study when planning on transferring.

Rockland Community College staff will assume responsibility for advising students interested in transferring to Stony Brook. Members of the Stony Brook Transfer Office will be available to provide telephone support to Rockland advisors and students. To be assured admission to Stony Brook the following additional conditions and requirements must be satisfied:

- 3.0 for admission into a College of Arts and Science major (Appendix B)
- 3.1 into College of Business major
- Grades of C or higher for all major courses
- Applications and transcripts to Stony Brook University must be received by November 1<sup>st</sup> or March 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the semester the student wishes to enroll
- Students on F1 or J1 Visas are not eligible to participate in this agreement
- Stony Brook University accepts transfer credits only, not course grades
- All transfer credit policies at Stony Brook University apply

This agreement shall be in effect for admission to Stony Brook beginning in the Fall 2010 semester. The agreement shall extend for one year from the date of execution and shall be deemed automatically renewed for succeeding annual terms unless either party notifies the other of its intention to terminate this agreement not less than six months prior to the intended termination. Such notice shall be in writing via certified mail, return receipt requested to the signatories below, or to their successors.
