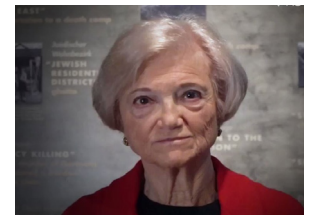

## HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR TESTIMONY

86 yr old Toby Levy was born in Chodorow, Poland. During WWII, she hid with her family from the Nazis in a barn for three months and in an attic for two years until they were liberated by the Red Army 1944. Her family immigrated to the US and lived in New Orleans. She is an employee of the Museum of Jewish Heritage in Battery Park City.
